Class 1 In Hand Mountain & Moorland

Pony of any age to be registered in their respective Pure Breed Stud Book.
Will be split into youngstock (1-3 Years) and 4 years and over, if sufficient entries

Class 2 In Hand Youngstock

Horses/ponies of 1, 2 or 3 years, any breed.

Class 3 Ridden Mountain & Moorland

Pony to be registered in its respective Pure Breed Stud Book. Spurs are not to be worn in this class.

Class 4 Ridden Part Bred/Unregistered Mountain & Moorland

Horse/Pony of Mountain & Moorland type but not registered in their respective Pure Breed Stud Book. Spurs are not to be worn in this class.

Class 5 Leading rein

Rider not to have reached their 8th birthday on 1st January 2010, pony not to exceed 138cm.
Pony to be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, leading rein attached to the noseband only. Rosette to every competitor.

Class 6 First Ridden Pony up to 138cm

Rider not to have reached their 10th birthday on 1st January 2010. Ponies to be shown in snaffle bridle. Rosette to every competitor.

Class 7 Ridden Pony up to 148 cm

Rider of any age but must be appropriately mounted. Spurs are not to be worn by riders under 16 years of age.

Class 8 Ridden Pony Championship

For those placed 1st or 2nd in classes 3 – 7 inclusive

Class 20 Ridden Palomino, Dun, Cremello, Roan

Rider of any age but must be appropriately mounted.

Class 21 Novice Pony

Pony 148cm and under. Combination not to have won 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a ridden showing class. Pony to be ridden in a snaffle bridle. Spurs may not to be worn in this class.

Class 22 Novice Horse

Over 148cm. Combination not to have won 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a ridden showing class. Horse to be ridden in a snaffle bridle. Spurs may not to be worn in this class.

Ring Two Not before 1.00pm

Judge Classes 23-26: Mrs Kate Kincaid

Class 23 Ridden Cob Type

Horse/Pony of any size of Cob type, may be shown with mane and/or feathers

Class 24 Family Pony

148cm and under. Will be asked to jump a small jump not exceeding 1'6" in height. Spurs not to be worn by riders under 16 years of age.

Class 25 Family Horse

Over 148cm. Will be asked to jump a small jump not exceeding 2'0" in height. Spurs not to be worn by riders under 16 years of age.

Class 26 Riding Club Horse/Pony

Will be asked to go over a small jump. 'Special' rosette to highest placed CVRC member riding a horse owned by a CVRC member

CVRC's Nominated Charity for 2010

Colne Valley Riding Club have a policy of nominating a charity each year and donations from profits from our shows are made to that charity. This year we have nominated The Animal Health Trust and we give below brief information and contact details for this worthwhile cause.

The Animal Health Trust (AHT) is a veterinary charity dedicated to improving the health and welfare of horses, dogs and cats. Despite popular belief, disease and injury are the most common threats to animal welfare, and we exist to reduce and prevent any unnecessary suffering.

Based near Newmarket, in Suffolk, the AHT has two animal clinics; one for dogs and cats, the other for horses. They are a veterinary referral centre, meaning that cases which are too complex to be treated by your local vet get referred to their world-class vets. They have a number of different units, each specialising in a particular area of veterinary expertise.

They are committed to developing better means of diagnosing and treating diseases of companion animals. With innovative and pioneering research programmes, they are at the forefront of developments for both inherited and infectious diseases. Their clinical and research experts work closely together to benefit not only individual cases, but the veterinary profession as a whole, internationally.

Conditions of Entry

No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fee.

All ridden horses/ponies to be 4 years old and over.

Owners enter their horses/ponies at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability attaches itself to the CVRC or the show organisers or assistants in any respect whatsoever.

Correct Riding Dress should be worn and hats with a fixed harness to a minimum standard of BS EN0384 or PAS 015 must be worn by riders at all times and should be securely fastened when mounted.

Instructions of organisers, officials and stewards should be obeyed in order to promote the health and safety of everyone present.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry, vary the order or composition of, or cancel any event in this schedule at any time.

The judge's decision is final.

Classes may be split or amalgamated or moved from one ring to another at the organisers' discretion.

Riders should be the correct height and weight for their horse or pony.

Objections must be made verbally to the Secretary within 10 minutes of the finish of the class in question, to be followed by a written objection within one hour of the finish of the class in question, accompanied by a deposit of £25, refundable only if the objection is upheld.

We have tried our best to avoid classes clashing, but sometimes it is inevitable.

We strongly urge all participants to have Third Party Insurance.
